English

This term we will be looking at fiction, discussions, biographies, autobiographies, reports and journalistic writing. The children will be learning about the features of the different genres in order to apply this in their own writing. They will also be reading extracts from a wide variety of different genres to further develop their comprehension skills.



Maths

The children will be learning about numbers and our number system. They will be developing both their mental and written methods for calculation. They will also be studying the properties of quadrilaterals, understanding conversion of measurement units and data handling.

Children will investigate how light travels and what objects reflect or transmit light. They will continue to carry out investigations thinking about 'fair testing'. Children will explore different circuits and their use in everyday life.




