English

This term we will be looking at fiction, discussions, biographies, autobiographies, reports and journalistic writing. The children will be learning about the features of the different genres in order to apply this in their own writing. They will also be reading extracts from a wide variety of different genres including books from the CLPE range to develop their comprehension skills.



Maths

The children will be learning about numbers and the number system. They will be developing both their mental and written methods for calculation and applying this in reasoning. They will also be studying the properties of quadrilaterals, understanding conversion of measurement, units and data handling. Children will also revise work done in Year 5.



Science

- Light
 - Electricity
- Children will investigate how light travels and which objects reflect or transmit light. They will continue to carry out investigations thinking about 'fair testing'. Children will explore different circuits and their uses in everyday life. They will learn about shadows and how these are formed.

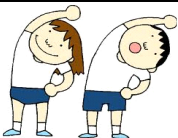
For RE lessons, we will continue to use the **Come and See** programme of study as our scheme of work and will be looking into:

PE

Music



In class, children will be exposed to various genres of music through listening and appraising. They will explore a programme called 'Charanga'

In History, the children will be exploring "Black History". They will look at the contributions made by Olaudah Equino, a Nigerian who lived in England during the 18th. century.

In Geography, the children will be studying 'Imports and exports in the 21st Century-Trade.'

Computing

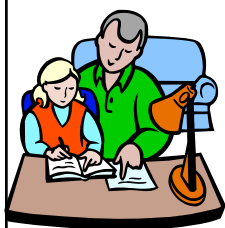


Children will further develop their understanding of computers by using different programmes such as Scratch, Microsoft Word, PowerPoint and Excel. They will practise publishing their work using these software.

Please read with your child regularly, using a range of reading materials e.g. newspapers, magazines etc. Encourage your child to talk with you about the books they are reading.
