### Coronavirus Update

As you are aware there is a new variant of concern called the Omicron variant. As a result, the Department for Education (DfE) guidance has changed and staff are required to wear a face covering in communal areas (but not in the classroom), visitors are also required to wear a face covering when in the school as well as pupils in year 7 and above.















As a school, we decided to return to wearing face coverings at the end of last week due to the rise in Covid cases in schools; we are reviewing our Covid measurements to ensure that we are keeping everyone as safe as possible. However, it is vital that you do not send your child to school if they have any Covid symptoms.

The main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child has any of the above symptoms please schedule a PCR test.
