R.W.I

This term we will begin the RWI phonics programme. Children will learn the sounds that will help them to read new words. We also learn how to write each sound paying special attention to the letter formation.



English

Alongside RWI children will also have English. In these lessons they will enjoy reading a variety of stories and poems like *We Are Going on a Bear Hunt*, *The Bog Baby* and *The Snowman*.

Maths

Children in Reception will learn how to count and recognise numbers to 20 in and out of order. They will be able to recognise and name 2D shapes and use them to copy and continue patterns. Children will be introduced to the idea of addition and subtraction as well as using the language of money and measurement.

Children will explore what makes them unique; they will learn about their bodies, how we grow, how humans are different from Animals and all our senses.

We will name body parts and learn how to draw the human figure.

For RE lessons we follow **Come and See** as our scheme of work.

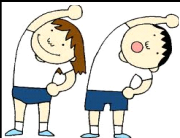
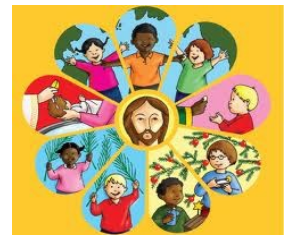

PE

Please ensure that your child brings appropriate PE kit on the correct day. Art & Design



Children will be looking at themselves and their bodies in detail and will produce self portraits.

We will explore different mediums and discuss which is the best one for each activity.

We will also be doing junk modelling to represent animals and humans and their body parts.

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Black History Month

During the month of September and October we will celebrate Black History Month and focus our learning on a fantastic book called Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain—a Kenyan folk story written by Verna Aardema. When a terrible drought hits the beautiful Kapiti Plain and the animals leave, young herd boy Ki-pat must find a way to end the drought and save the wildlife on the plain.



Computing

Children will learn to log on to the laptops and iPads and use educational resources to support their work.

As part of the curriculum we will introduce children to the use of Google Classroom where they will be completing their weekly homework.

Children will be encouraged to role play with other children in small groups. They will learn to take turns, listen and respond to others as they learn to interact in positive ways with their peers.

Homework



Children in Reception will receive handwriting homework on a regular basis. Please support them to hold their pencil correctly (tripod grip) whilst forming the letters.

We also encourage you to help your child by counting and recognising numbers to 20 and practising the sounds they have learnt in school. On Fridays we will post Maths and English homework in Google Classroom. This needs to be completed by the following Tuesday.
