English

Year 3 will be exploring the text 'The Great Kapok Tree' this term. It is a story about the rainforest and the importance of the preservation of nature. 'The Great Kapok Tree' will also inspire lively class debates and persuasive writing.

We will be studying the author's description of the rainforest setting and use powerful adjectives to create our own setting descriptions—as well as creating watercolours based on the rainforest.

Maths

Children will be recapping their number facts and place value. They will be comparing and ordering numbers with up to 3 digits. Children will learn multiplication and division facts for the 2,3,4,5, 8 and 10 times-tables, add and subtract 1-digit numbers to and from 2-digit and 3-digit numbers. They will apply this knowledge to word problems and reasoning questions. Later in the term, they will be exploring time and the vocabulary 'past' and 'to' to explain what time it is. The children will be looking at place value in relation to money and solving problems including giving change.

Science



Forces and Magnets

Children will compare how things move on different surfaces. They will also observe how magnets attract and repel each other and attract some materials and not others. The children will create their own compass using magnets and household materials.

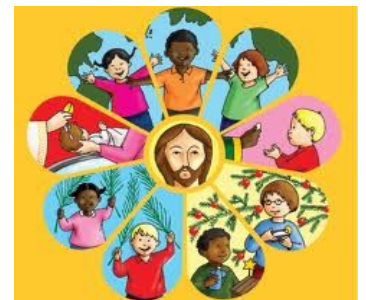
Light

Year 3 will identify light sources and including the Sun. They will also establish that light is reflected off things that we see and that darkness is an absence of light. Then they will look at the transparency of various materials and the shadows they form.

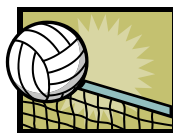
For RE lessons we use the **Come and See** scheme of work. We will be focusing on:

Foundation Subjects



History: Black History—As part of our Black History month studies, the children will be exploring ancient African civilizations and will focus on the kingdom of Ghana.

Computing



Word Processing Skills

The children will be using Google docs and slides and will focus on changing text size, aligning text, and using bullet points.

Online Safety

Children will be taught to recognise and define cyber bullying and how to stay safe online.

PSHE



Children will begin Autumn by learning about the 'Zones of Regulation.' Learning about these zones will help children think about how they feel and how they can help calm themselves down when upset or over excited. This term we will also have a focus week on anti-bullying, to ensure our school continues to be a safe place for all.

Children are expected to complete their own homework on Google Classroom, parents need to ensure that their child completes their work to a high standard and check it over before their child turns it in.
