




Geography—America We will learn about the different human and physical features of America, using our locational knowledge, and compare places in America to the UK. We focus in on the Grand Canyon, exploring this unique physical feature of America.

History—The Anglo-Saxons In this topic about UK history, we will explore who the Anglo-Saxons were and where they came from. We will also use various sources to find out about daily life in Anglo-Saxon times, including what life was like for children, the art and crafts that the Anglo-Saxons produced and discovering facts about famous kings.



Scratch - Developing Games

We will be using Scratch to build and edit algorithms for simple games. Children will develop their skills in writing their own algorithms as well as editing and debugging existing codes. We will also learn general safety in using computers and e-safety rules.
