English

Children will be reading a range of stories with familiar settings and will write descriptive settings of their own. They will be exploring some of the tales from the Centre for Literacy in Primary Education- (The Power of Reading), then writing their own stories and producing art work based on the books read. We will also be looking at writing instructions, fantasy stories and imagery in poetry. For this term, children will be reading the books- 'Fly Eagle Fly' by Christopher Gregorowski and 'Wolves in the Walls by Neil Gaiman



Maths

Children will be developing their understanding of place value and comparing and ordering two, three and four-digit numbers. They will be learning about the four number operations to a greater depth. Children will also learn measurement, properties of shape telling the time and calculating time intervals. They will continue to develop their recall of multiplication facts.



Sciemce



Children will encounter how sounds are made on a variety of instruments and how they can be changed in volume, pitch and over distance. They will explore making sounds on a range of objects that aren't instruments, in order to investigate how sounds are created to make music .

Teeth and eating

Children learn about digestion and different types of teeth, before moving on to explore deadly predators and their prey, in their exploration of food chains. They work scientifically throughout the topic, using enquiry, practical experiments and hands-on research to answer questions and investigate how we

eat, why we eat and what we eat.



For RE lessons we will continue to use Come and See as our scheme of work and will be looking

PEOPLE: The Family of God in scripture -Our Family Tree.

ST FRANCIS: Explore the life of St. Francis.

JUDAISM: The Torah CALLED: Confirmation

GIFTS: God's gift of Love and Friendship







Please ensure that your child brings the appropriate kit on the correct day. Lessons will take place on Tuesdays.

During Autumn 2, children will be swimming. They will learn new strokes and techniques. Children will also be taught about water safety as well as Health and Safety both in and around water.



In French, children will learn basic vocabulary about food and playtimes. They will learn through songs, games and speaking and listening activities.

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History & Geography

This October we will focus on 'Black History month. Children will explore what life was like for the Windrush Generation in London. Pupils will look at what was their motivation to come to England, their expectations and how different was the reality.

In Autumn 2, Pupils will explore the physical and human geography of Modern Europe. They will investigate key European physical features, research a European capital city and examine the weather from each of Europe's climate zones



Circle time will provide opportunities for our children to express their feelings and give them time and space to share their thoughts.

Pupils will explore how to regulate their emotions using the Zones of Regulation during well-being time.

Computing

Children will apply their knowledge and understanding of networks, to appreciate the internet as a network of networks which need to be

kept secure. They will learn that the World Wide Web is part of the internet, and will be given opportunities to explore this. They will learn about input and output devices required to work with sound digitally and about the copyright implications of duplicating the work of others.

Music



Children will be following the scheme of work— Charanga! They will explore songs from Mama Mia and will learn themes such as pitch, rhythm as well as other genres of music.

Children will have the chance to use instruments as well as explore body percussion.



Homework

Children are expected to complete their own homework, however, parents need to check that all the work put online on **Google Classroom** is completed. Homework is set on a **Friday** and is due in on **Tuesday**. Homework submitted after Tuesday will be marked as late.
