History & Geography

History – Year 3 will be introduced to the idea that people have been living in Britain for a very long time. They will learn about the changes that occurred between the middle Stone Age [Mesolithic Times] to the Iron Age – a period of over 10,000 years.

Geography - This unit of study encourages children to use atlases to identify the names of the seas surrounding the UK. They will then go on to find out about some of the larger UK rivers and further explore the names of the seas some of the UK rivers flow into. Children learn how to follow different UK rivers on a map to find out where they start and end.

Computing

Children will be increasing their knowledge and understanding of coding using Scratch. Scratch is a visual programming language that allows students to create their own interactive stories, games and animations. The children will be finding out about data and information and what branching databases are.





During the citizenship weeks, the children will explore the theme 'Equality Matters'. Year 3 will focus on the protected characteristic of Religion and Culture, exploring the symbols and beliefs of some other religions and why our right to religious belief and cultural identity are important.



Homework

Children are expected to complete their own homework on Google Classroom, parents need to ensure that their child completes their work to a high standard and check it before their child turns it in.

Homework is assigned on Friday and is due back on Tuesday. If homework is not returned on Tuesday it may not be marked.

Reading at home Please read with your child



every day and ask them questions about the book. Please sign their reading journal once you have heard them read. The home/school reading books should be brought in to school every day and will be changed weekly.

French

The children will begin to learn how to talk about different parts of the body in French. Further on in the half term, the children will begin to talk about animals and pets that they may have.
