



#### English & Big Write

Children will begin more challenging comprehension activities this term reading texts carefully so they can answer recall and inference questions. Children will also have regular grammar lessons to learn about word types, conjunctions as well as prefixes and suffixes and how these change words. In Big Write lessons, children will continue to improve their writing skills by ensuring sentences are punctuated correctly and make sense. They will plan, write and edit their very own stories as well a reports and

#### Maths

Year 1 will continue to practise and imbed key skills. Children will aim to become quick calculators by using number facts to add and subtract with larger numbers. They will also understand place value and how this can help us with addition and subtraction. Children will continue to count in steps of 2, 5 and 10 and begin to recognise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. We will delve a little deeper into 3D shapes and begin to measure length, time and capacity with greater accuracy.



#### Science Children will start the

term exploring the topic of 'Celebrations.' Celebrations often require bright lights, music and delicious food. So in this topic the children will explore different light sources, how sound travels as well as how to prepare healthy food. Children will then move on to explore 'Animals and Plants Where We Live'. We will plant seeds and watch them grow, thinking about the best conditions needed for a young seedling. We will also visit the Natural History Museum to discover



even more about the different kids of animals we have learnt about this year.

RE For this term, we will cover the following topics in RE lessons:

HOLIDAYS AND HOLYDAYS - Pentecost: feast of the Holy Spirit. Children will explore the feast of Pentecost and how the Holy Spirit made the disciples brave and full of energy to spread the good news. We will also see how the Holy Spirit can help us all today.

BEING SORRY - God helps us choose well. Children will begin to learn about reconciliation and how when we make mistakes or bad choices, we feel sorry and can ask for forgiveness. We will also discuss how we can ask God to help us make good choices.



NEIGHBOURS— Neighbours share God's world. In this unit, children will learn how we are all neighbours as we all share God's world together, our common home. Pope Francis has challenged us to care for creation and think about our global neighbours and children will learn about what little changes they can make to help care for the Earth.

## History & Geography

Year 1 will begin the term learning about Pirates in their History lessons. They will explore how the popular image of a pirate is far from the historical truth. They will focus on the famous Irish pirate Grace O'Malley, who terrorised the waters off the west coast of Ireland and even had an audience with Queen Elizabeth I.


Then after half term we will focus on our International topic, leading up to our annual celebration of International Day. Year One will be learning about **the Philippines.** As well as learning a traditional Filipino dance and how to design and prepare an authentic Filipino food children will also explore the physical and human features of this island nation.





#### Computing

Year 1 will focus on word processing in the first half of the term. They will learn how to change fonts, text sizes as well as some keyboard short
