In Year 2, the children will begin by reading 'The Dark' by Lemony Snicket. This book is all about a boy, Laszlo, who is afraid of the dark. This story supports children to develop understanding and empathy through in depth exploration of character viewpoint. It offers young readers a good stimulus for their own descriptive writing as well as some challenging non-fiction text types. After half term children will then read Anna Hibiscus by Atinuke, which is all about Anna who lives in Africa with her large family. This story will help children explore differences and complexities of cultural and personal identities. This story will also inspire children to write poetry and write in role.



what they have mastered in Year 1. Children will use place value to order numbers and compare them. Children will

continue to develop their mental maths skills, using number facts they already know to add and subtract with larger numbers. Children will also classify 2D shapes using different sorting diagrams as well as develop their vocabulary around position and movement. Children will learn how to measure in centimetre and metres and compare lengths. The Year 2 children will also have the fantastic opportunity to learn how to play chess as part of their weekly maths lessons. Learning to play chess will help the children develop their reasoning and problem solving skills. Year 2 is also when children begin to focus more on learning their times tables by heart, starting with x 2, x5 and x10.

























To start off the new academic year in Science, pupils will learn about materials. Children start by classifying objects by the materials they are made from, learning about their different properties such as whether they are elastic, waterproof, transparent or opaque. They will then explore how these properties make them suitable for specific purposes. They will go on to explore how the shapes of objects can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. In doing this they raise questions, perform simple tests, and gather and record data.



Children in Year 2 will have 2 main RE topics (branches) to explore this Autumn term.

Branch 1-Creation and Covenant Noah and Sacrament of Baptism

Children will explore the story of Noah in the Old Testament, focussing on how God made a new start for creation and make a covenant (promise) using the sign of the rainbow. Children will link this story to the sacrament of Baptism, how it is a sign of a new start of our lives as part of the church family.



In this branch, pupils will explore the Christian understanding of the teaching of the prophets as they point to the fulfillment of God's promise in a messiah, Jesus Christ.

The 4th of October is the Feast of St Francis. We will celebrate our school's patron saint on this day.



Regular reading is vital for all children, it develops their comprehension and confidence. Children will come home with two

reading books every week. They should read them at home with an adult. Parents should also discuss the plot, characters or information in the book with their child to deepen their understanding. Parents are also encouraged to make comments in their children's reading records. Children should bring their reading books in everyday and read them at home every evening.



PE is **every Wednesday**

In the Autumn term, children

will learn about different games and fitness, with a particular focus on ball skills. They will also learn various dance steps and routines after the half term.

In October, children will start their Black History topic. Our overall topic for 2024 will be 'Journeys.' This year, the pupils in 2K and 2J will explore the extraordinary life and journey of Mary Seacole. Mary Seacole started her life in Kingston Jamaica before moving to central America and then coming to the UK. She wanted to help British soldiers during the Crimean War (1853-56) and travelled to the Crimea (then part of the Russian Empire, now in Ukraine) where she established the 'British Hotel.' She used

her own resources and became a celebrated figure among the soldiers. After the half term break children will start their first Geography topic of Year 2. They will learn about the world's Oceans and Seas. Through a series of lively and interesting activities the children will build their knowledge of oceans and seas around the world. They will begin to understand the different environments these represent and how they affect life on land as well as at sea. They will develop their geographical skills and build up their knowledge of food chains, exploration, and evolution.





Our first unit of work is called 'IT Around Us.' Children will then investigate how IT improves our world, and they will learn about the importance of using ICT responsibly.

Then the next unit is: 'Digital Photography' 2J & 2K will learn to recognise that different devices can be used to capture photographs and will gain experience capturing, editing, and improving photos. Finally, they will use this knowledge to recognise that images they see may not be real.



ofirst topic is 'Hands, Feet, Heart!' This unit uses Nouth African music and Freedom Songs. Through this music children will learn a little about Nelson Mandela as a famous and influential person in our lifetimes. Children will also explore the historical context of different musical styles. The second unit is called 'Ho, ho, ho' and will help the children get into the Christmas Spirit. Children will also begin to rehearse for their Nativity production.

Children will begin Autumn reminding themselves about the 'Zones of Regulation.' Learning about these zones will help children think about how they feel and how they can help calm themselves down when upset or over excited. This term we will also focus on Anti-Bullying, ensure our school continues to be a safe place for all.



Homework is set on Google Classroom.

Children should log on to Google Classroom at home using the same log in details they used last year in Year 1. They do not need to enter a new class code. Every week there will be one piece of English and one piece of Maths homework. The weekly spellings will also be posted.

Homework is <u>set on Friday</u> and is due to be <u>returned by Tuesday</u>. Remember to click the 'turn in' button so the homework can be marked. Spelling tests will be **on Fridays**, giving children a whole week to practise them.





Children in Year 2 now have a Times Tables Rock Stars account. This website is a fun and competitive way for children to practise their times tables. Children, as part of their homework should regularly log on to Times Table Rock Stars. Regular use will boost the chil-

dren's fluency in multiplication and division.



The Year 2 children will start learning the names of animals and revising the names of family members in the first half of the term.


